CHANGE OF PROGRAMME - Camp Ilkley Friday night - climb Ilkley Saturday - camp Almscliffe Sat. night, climb Almscliffe Sunday.

The Meet Leader still intends to camp on Ilkley Moor (with 'at) on the Friday night, near the Highfield Hotel. Climbing on the Cow & Calf or in the Quarry on the Saturday morning and walking over to climb in the Rocky Valley in the afternoon. Leaving for Almscliffe camp site at about 6 p.m. Expect to arrive about 7 p.m. at Almscliffe.

Camp site at Crain Syke farm - map ref. 270498 - in the field bounded on W. side by wood & stream, on S. side by main stream M.R. 270496. To find this farm at Almscliffe, turn off to the N. in Rigton, beside the 'Square & Compass' on the road to Beckwithshaw. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile up the road, pass through a gate beside a cottage on the left, marked 'Crain Syke Farm'. Transport may be taken up the drive $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the farm and a track on the right leads to the camp site field. Permission has been obtained to drive on to the camp site. This is $\frac{1}{3}$ mile from the Crag, which can be reached by a route avoiding climbing any walls.

Camping fee is 2/- per tent per night, which probably can be worked out more fairly at 1/- per head per night.

Will those arriving at Almscliffe camp site early on Saturday afternoon, contact the farmer, Mr. Harper, first, before pitching.
