The camp site will be at the usual place. To quote last years meets circular:- 'By the old mine buildings, Map Ref. 702. 152, o.s. sheet No. 116 Dolgellley. For the Benefit of anyone who has not been there before, descend into Dolgellley from Dinas Mawddwy, A458, go through the town, and turn left by the chapel, along a minor road past Llyn Gwernan, until a telephone kiosk is reached, go through a gate by the bridge up the N.W. slope of Cader Idris, across the stream and up to the old buildings, about 500yds. It is essential that the farmer be approached early on Sat morning if we are to retain the use of this camp site.

Although not generally known there is quite a lot of good rock climbing on Cader. The cliffs above Llyn -y- Gader and in the Cwm that holds Llyn Cau (One of the most perfect Cwms in Wales) all contain routes of various standards. The meet leader is the chap to see for more information.

At this time of the year the Cader area is at it's best and even the drive there should prove enjoyable.

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BURBAGE. JULY 16/17th.

It is usually possible to climb on Burbage edge without having to fight ones way through the crowds, as is usual on most of the gritstone edges at this time of the year.

The camp site will be on the East side of Burbage Brook close to the stream about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile from the road (A605) Ref. O S. map No 111 265813. Cars can be parked off the road by the path which runs below the edge. There is a good bus service from Bakewell to the Fox House Inn from which the edge is a few minutes walk away.
