It is anticipated that the more valiant Oreads will leave their native edges and journey north to the unique selection of rocks at Brimham. The rocks comprise a normal but broken edge and a considerable number of other rock formations covering an area of 60 acres and situated about 2 miles north of Summerbridge. Summerbridge lies on the Harrogate to Patley Bridge Road and can conveniently be reached from the south through Leeds, Otley and along the B 6451 for about 12 miles.

To the left of the 'Flying Dutchman' at Summerbridge a steep road leads to the rocks. A track leads off the road to the left and this is signposted to "Brimham Rocks". Follow this track for approx 20yds and left again along another track. Pass through a rust coloured gate which leads to the camp site at Highwood Farm. Do not pass through the white gate along this track.

Brimham Rocks, as most Yorkshire Crags, are on private land. They are a local beauty spot and an entrance fee of 1/- is payable if caught.

Climbing will be on the crag on Saturday but the arrangements for Sunday are flexible, but a number of keen walkers in the club hope to do the 'Three Peaks'.

Geoff Hayes has kindly agreed to negotiate transport arrangements with vehicle owners in the 'Bell'.
