ORDAD MOUNTAINEERIG CLUB NEWSLETTER THE DERBYSHIRE HIMALAYAN EXPEDITION 1961. JANUARY 1962. Preliminary Report.

Pending the preparation of a comprehensive account and map describing the activities and journeys of the expedition the following notes are sent for your information.

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The expedition was in the field from the end of May to the middle of July 1961.

Listed below are the ascents achieved by the expedition:

- (a) White Sail, 21,148 ft. The second ascent.
- (b) Deo Tibba, 19,687 ft. (Twice)
 The fourth and fifth ascent.
- (C) The Manikaren Spires, 17,692 ft. and 17,000 ft. First ascents.

The expedition also made the first ascent of the 18,000 ft. Ice Pass in the Bera Shigri/Kulu Devide, and completeted a plane-table survey of the East Tos nullah glacier.

At a point some 800ft. in vertical height below the summit of Indrasan, 20,410 ft., on the West Ridge, the final assault pair were forced to turn back defeated by the sheer difficulty and length of the rock and ice climbing. An attempt on the East ridge was abandoned at a lower level for the same reason.


