Brimham Rocks, Yorkshire

These are a unique group of rock formations with a short edge and well worth a visit. The climbs vary in standard with many interesting problems and are well defined in the West Yorkshire Area guide book. 1/- is payable for climbing - if caught by the eagle eyed collector.

The route from Derby & Nottingham is by way of the A1, turning off to Harrogate or Ripley and west along the B6165 to Summer Bridge. At Summer Bridge the road to Brimham is on the right hand side of the B6165 up a steep hill. The camp site is situated near to the rocks. The road from Summer Bridge is intersected by cross roads and a well defined track lies about half a mile past the cross roads on the left hand side of the road. The camp site lies on the left of this track along another track - first on the left leading to Wiseman's farm 20 yards before reaching a pay box. Cars can be left in the paddock near to the farm.

Yorkshire Meet

This meet is divided into two parts:

Saturday

A Walk covering the three peaks; Pon-y-ghant, 2,273 ft. Wharfedale, 2,419 ft. & Ingleborough 2,373 ft. from Horton in Ribblesdale. This is a fine walk in limestone country - approximate distance 22 miles - total ascent about 4,600 ft.

Sunday

Climbing on Cookrise Crag. This is a gritstone edge which lies at a height of 1,300 ft. and is situated approximately  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles due north from Skipton. There are 45 climbs listed in the West Yorkshire area guide book. The climbs are of a high standard but there should be sufficient to meet all tastes for a good day's climbing. Transport will be by private vehicles from the camp-site in Horton to within striking distance of Cookrise. An early start on both Saturday and Sunday will be desirable.

The Camp-site is near to the centre of Horton in Ribblesdale which is situated about  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles north of Settle - Map Ref. OS 1" Sensleydale Sheet 90 - 809726. Travel north from Settle immediately over the second bridge in Horton is situated the Crown Hotel outside of which vehicles should be parked. With the Crown Hotel on the left walk forward about 25 yards - turn sharp right and with a wall on the left move forward about 20 yards to the first gate. Camping will be in the field over the brow of the hill (Mr. Lambert's field).

A quiet arrival will assist in maintaining the goodwill of the villagers. Transport to the camp-site will be arranged in the Bell.

Advance Notice - Don't forget to prepare your entries for this year's Photo meet on October 27th. Ray Handley is organizing it this year and has managed to get C. D. Milner to act as judge. More details in the next circular or newsletter.

PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION RULES

1. There are two separate competitions.
  - (1) Colour Transparencies.
  - (2) Black and White Prints.
2. The winner in each competition shall hold a cup for twelve months.
3. Sections. The division of sections will apply for both competitions
  - (1) Mountaineering at Home.
    - (a) General Views.
    - (b) Action.
  - (2) Mountaineering Abroad.
    - (a) General Views.
    - (b) Action.
  - (3) Club Interest. (This section to be judged by the President.)
4. The first three slides or prints in each section will be awarded points 3,2,1, for 1st 2nd and 3rd respectively. The competition winner being the entrant with the highest number of points.
5. The maximum permitted number of entries will be 3 in each section ie, maximum total of 15 colour and 15 Black and White.
6. No print or transparency placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any previous Oread competition may be entered.
7. All colour transparencies must be mounted in glass or plastic preferably 2"X2" (other sizes accepted but may not be shown on the night of the competition if no suitable projector available). Slides must be spotted in bottom left hand corner (looking at slide correct way round) and marked with competitors name, section and sub section entered. Black and White prints to be not less than whole plate 8½"X6½" and mounted. Prints to be marked with name, section and sub-section entered
8. Members are to be encouraged to enter Black and White transparencies. If sufficient entries under this heading are submitted a separate competition with a small prize will be held.
