MARSDEN/ROWSLEY/STANAGE

Located well within the defined limits of the meet is a classic high level moorland walk, the Sixteen Stones. I think I've sorted out the sixteen, but in any case by the 9th October I will have consulted authorities on this classic bog trot to obtain precise details. At present my interpretation follows a route along Blackden Edge, Seal Edge, Bleaklow, Howden Moors to Derwent Edge. Rendezvous the Marquis of Granby, Bamford, Friday night. Cars may be parked for the weekend at the rear of the garage opposite the hotel, having first obtained permission from the proprietor. I suggest then a 10.30 p.m. start from the Granby to bivvy the night at Crookstone Barn (1" O.S. ref. 158877). The party can either walk the whole distance or a better idea would be for some kind car owner not doing the walk to ferry people up to the Edale End (161862). The meet would then be assembled ready for an early start Saturday morning for Madwomans Stones.

People will readily appreciate that there are a multiplicity of walks to finish at the Ladybower Inn on Saturday night, but the object is to attempt the whole round of Stones, finishing with Hurkling. I've already been party to the ruination of one classic traverse this year; I don't want to make it a double!

Saturday night will be bivvy at North Lees farm ready for climbing at Stanage on Sunday. I'm sure there will be sufficient stamina left to hit the rock. If not the two mile wander down to the cars at Bamford should not prove too much.

Finally, don't let it ever be said the Marsden Rowsley is finished. If members wish to form their own party for the traditional walk that weekend, by all means do - but finish at Rowsley for fear of the wrath of Falkner!

Rules - As previous years, so this is only a brief summary.

- A. There will be two separate competitions, (a) Black and White Prints and (b) Colour Transparencies.
- B. Sections - these sub-divisions apply to both sections.
 - (1) Mountaineering at Home
 - (a) General Views
 - (b) Action
 - (2) Mountaineering Abroad
 - (a) General Views
 - (b) Action
 - (3) Club Interest - (to be judged by the President).
- C. Slides will be awarded points for position in each section, winner will be person with most points.
- D. Each entrant allowed 3 entries/section (or sub-section). i.e. Max. of 15 prints or 15 transparencies.
- E. Slides or prints placed in previous Oread Competitions barred.
- F. Slides to be mounted in glass or plastic mounts, preferably 2" x 2", and correctly spotted and marked with name, section and sub-section. B/W prints not less than 1/2 plate in size.

Note Transparencies to be in R. Handley's (Hon. Organizer) possession, not later than Tuesday October 12th. B/W prints by Tuesday October 19th.
