GRASSINGTON

The area provides the most impressive limestone scenery in the country with both free & artificial climbing at Malham Cove G.R. 89764I & Gardale Scar G.R. 01564I in an extremely pleasant environment. The 'Yorkshire Limestone (1968) Guide Book will be found very useful. The free routes are of excellent quality, The artificial routes tend to be a little serious & a working knowledge of the prussik-loop may be useful. Non-rock climbers have only to cast a glance at O.S. sheet to see the potential for walking. The campsite is on the N.E. side of the River Wharfe in Grass Wood G.R. 986648 Cars will have to be left at the roadside (laybys) Go through a gate & descend gently through trees (50yds) to an open but secluded field on the river bank. I shall be in the Devonshire Arms in Grassington village until closing time on Friday evening. Best approach is via the M1, Leeds, Otley, Ilkley & Bolton Abbey.
