Turn left off the main Borrowdale Road about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile south of Rosthwaite, & follow the sign for Stonethwaite. When Stonethwaite Hotel is reached the road divides into two tracks (wide enough for Dormobiles) the right hand track should be taken & followed until a gate gives access to the campsite on the left.

The rules are set out below & particular attention should be paid to rule No. 5 concerning the mounting & identification of slides in order that there is no doubt concerning a) the ownership of the exhibit b) the section of entry & c) the correct way round for projection.

The competition rules are as follows:-

1. The competition will be limited to 35mm colour transparencies suitably mounted for projection on a screen
2. There are two cups, one for overall 1st place & the other for overall 2nd place. They will be held for 1 year.
3. The sections of the competition will be divided as follows

- a) General Views
- b) Action
- B. Mountaineering Abroad.
  - a) General Views
  - b) Action
  - c) Club Interest (To be judged by the President)
- 4. Number of entries to be three(3) in each section giving a total of fifteen (15)
- 5. No transparency placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in a previous Oread Competition to be entered.
- 6. All transparencies to be mounted in glass or plastic preferably 2" x 2". They should be spotted in Bottom Left Hand Corner looking at slide correct way round & marked with the competitors name & appropriate section of entry i.e. Mountaineering Abroad-General Views.
- 7. Points will be awarded for 1st, 2nd & 3rd places in each sub-section on the basis of 3 points for 1st, 2 for 2nd & 1 for 3rd. The competitor obtaining the greatest points aggregate after judging of the five sections is completed shall be declared the winner.

A final note -- For those intending to make a weekend of it, limited places are available at Heathy Lea.

Climbing, walking driving over rough roads, walking across a wet moor with your gear to a hut a mile away from your car, even Survival if the weather is bad, all this & no pub can be yours if you care to come on the Eigiau meet. In fact a real mountaineering weekend for a change. Eigiau Cottage has been booked for the weekend & IF we get the hut key I hope to be in residence on the Fri. night. 10 beds only but camping is possible & has been managed by a few hardy Oreads in the past. I am open to bookings for the hut as soon as you have read this circular, so if you are keen Get in!! I suggest that if you are in at the hut you pack all your gear in your sack & keep your boots & torch handy for the walk from car to hut (a bit too wet for shoes as a rule) No need for the monkey suits on this weekend! Camping below the Dam Wall & it is possible to find quite a few good spots to put a tent, this is also the place to park your car, but please make sure it is off the track. In the event of an accident it is possible to get a Landrover up Cwm Eigiau to Craig-yr-Ysfa but not if cars are blocking the track How to get there - From Bettws-y-Coed take the B5106 through Trefiw & Dolgarrog to Tal-y-Bont turn left (G.R. 767688) keeping the Afon dilyn on the right, follow this but do not turn for Rowlyn, bear left for PWLL-DU passing the Afon Porth llwyd Reservoir on the right. Follow the road now to the Dam wall at Llyn Eigiau (GR 724649) Park here. Then follow track for about 1 mile in direction of Craig-yr-Ysfa to find Eigiau Cottage G.R.713638 (Take the right hand fork over bridge over tributary in to Llyn Eigiau.) Plenty to do in this area. Good mountain walking on the Carnedd's & all grades of climbing on Craig-yr-Ysfa. All Grid Refs. on SHEET 107. See me at the 'Wilmot' for lifts etc.
