OFFICIAL OPENING OF HEATHY LEA

Mrs. Ivy Byne has agreed to officially open Heathy Lea on Saturday 10 th September, prior to the Extraordinary General Meeting and the Photo Meet.

The order of proceedings will be as follows:-

1. At 3pm (sharp) the President will introduce Ivy Byne and "set the tone".
2. Ivy Byne will declare the Cottage open, unveiling a small plaque.
3. Alf Bridge will reply on behalf of the Oread M.C. and Eric's friends.

A barrel of ale and a reasonable amount of sherry will be available, but no food will be provided. The Cottage Sub-Committee will attempt to provide some glasses, but it is suggested that members might provide themselves with tankards etc., for the occasion. I would also be grateful for a reserve supply of ale which a few of the more generous members might like to bring with them and donate to the cause (seven pint cans would be most useful.)

It is probable that up to 100 persons will be present, most of them with vehicles, and it is therefore important that a complete shambles is avoided in the immediate vicinity of the Cottage.

On this occasion I think that parking of cars at the top of the access road (next to the gate) is permissible but, PLEASE no cars in front or at the side of the Cottage. This space will be required for circulation etc., In the car park at the rear it will, of course, be first come, first served.

Also please note that the Cottage will be closed for normal (and abnormal) use for one week (including the week end 3/4th October). before the opening --- unless you are involved in a working party.

Should anyone wish to camp in the area between the barns, or even behind the big barn (the area has been recently scythed), please let me know.

Notwithstanding the state in which you might find yourself by the completion of the Heathy Lea opening ceremony, you are expected to present yourself at the 'OAK' by 7.00pm. for an hours yawn whilst the committee bend rule 15. Actually the extraordinary meeting has been cunningly arranged to follow the opening on the basis that everyone will be so pissed that they don't really appreciate that the subs. are going up.

So, to hell with rule 15, this is the start of the Oread 21 st. Social season and the real business gets under way at 8.00pm. with the projection of 1970's slides, (some no doubt taken in 1960 — or 1950 — or..... Do you remember a picture of a glass of beer winning ?)

The rules of the competition (which will be Judged by Douglas Milner) are as follows:-

All slide entries must be in the hands of the Meet Leader by Tuesday evening 6th. October together with the entry fee of 2/6d. per person. The rules are set out below and particular attention should be paid to rule No. 6 concerning the mounting and identification of slides in order that there is no doubt concerning a) the ownership of the exhibit b) the section of entry and c) the correct way round for projection.

The competition rules are as follows:-

1. The competition will be limited to 35mm. colour transparencies suitably mounted for projection on a screen.
2. There are two cups, one for overall 1st. place and the other for overall 2nd. place. They will be held for 1 year only.
3. The sections of the competition will be divided as follows:-
 - A. Mountaineering at Home.
 - a) General Views.
 - b) Action.
 - B. Mountaineering Abroad.
 - a) General Views.
 - b) Action.
 - c) Club Interest (To be judged by the President)
4. Number of entries to be three (3) in each section, except Club Interest, in which 4 are allowed giving a total of 16.
5. No transparency placed 1st., 2nd. or 3rd. in a previous Oread Competition to be entered.
6. All transparencies to be mounted in glass or plastic preferably 2"x2". They should be spotted in Bottom Left Hand Corner looking at slide correct way round and marked with the competitors name and appropriate section of entry ie. Mountaineering Abroad - General Views.
Any slide not so marked will not be JUDGED.

7. Points will be awarded for 1st., 2nd. and 3rd. places in each sub-section on the basis of 3 points for 1st., 2 points for 2nd. and 1 point for 3rd. The competitor obtaining the greatest points aggregate after judging of the five sections is completed, shall be declared the winner.

We are using Appleby's projector so bring candles just in case! During 21 years of Oread we've seen a slide or two and, to mark this occasion, there will be an additional prize for the slide which, in the view of a panel of Founder Members present, raises the biggest laugh of the evening, (This prize will not automatically go to Nat Allen for his 'FLESH' pictures.) One extra slide per person is therefore allowed in the club interest section— the section as a whole being judged by the President plus a bonus for the biggest giggle — So don't forget to look out that funny oldy in addition to this years action.
