The Lakes are at their best in late September and if we are lucky enough to be blessed with the recent exceptional weather this meet should provide ample opportunity to couple good climbing with excellent walking and a possible winner for next year's Photo Meet. For those unfamiliar with this valley the area, as yet unspoilt, offers good climbing of all grades on Dow, Wallowbarrow and Seathwaite Buttress all within walking distance of the camp site.

Climbers are welcome in the Seathwaite pub which is about 15 minutes walk and provides good beer and bar snacks (hot and cold).

Approach:- M6/A6/A590 etc. to Broughton-in-Furness, turning off at Duddon Bridge to Ulpha. Continue straight up the valley to Seathwaite, through the village (avoiding the chapel) and after about 500 yards fork right into a lane which bears right again and rises steeply into the farmyard. Through the farm yard (watch your sump) to the site where toilets and water facilities are available. Charge - 15p per person per night. No access for caravans.
