For those of you who were unable to attend the general meeting the result was an overwhelming vote in favour of scheme B, i.e. that we have an extension built to accommodate the wash room, toilets, and drying room. The financing of this project will probably mean that the Club will have to find roughly £1000 from its members. It was decided that this money should be raised in the form of interest free loans, in much the same way that the money was raised when the property was purchased.

The idea is that each member loans as much as he feels able (remember that every little helps). As the money becomes available for repayment each 'stock holder' will be allocated a ticket for each unit of \$5 (or less) which is owed to them. These tickets will then be put into a hat and will be drawn at random - repayment then being made to the appropriate share holders. It is expected that repayment should be completed in three or four years time.

It is important that the 'Extension Fund' gets off to a good start so that we can show that we have the necessary cash to the Sports Council when our grant application goes before them in August/September, so please send your contributions to Lol Burns as soon as possible.

As some of you will have realised already, my congratulations to the B.M.C. over their insurance scheme were a little premature. It appears that under the trade descriptions act all participants in the scheme should sign a copy of the actual policy. Colin Hobday has been in touch with the B.M.C. and obtained a limited number of 'covering documents'.
