BMC TRAINING GRANT

(The Committee have written in support of the BMC to the MP for Derby North, who has said that he will put the views expressed in the letter to Dennis Howell, to whom a copy has been sent.) URGENT - TO ALL MOUNTAINEERS

The BMC is now in serious dispute with the Sports Council which is supposed to INFLUENCE British sport, not CONTROL it. (See Sports Council Annual Report 1975/76, Foreword by Sir Robin Brook).

Within the last few days, arbitrarily and without consultation, the Sports Council has <u>cut off the BMC Training Grant</u> thus jeopardising the future of a well proven and well run operation existing for over 5 years, guided by the Technical Adviser, Peter Boardman.

The Sports Council propose to cut the BMC grant by 50%. Not only does this affect the training side of the BMC, it endangers all the functions of the BMC, and its continued operation.

The BMC considers that the Sports Council is wrong, ill advised and destruct-ive.

It would be wrong and unsafe for a body other than the BMC to attempt to set standards of competence in mountaineering since the BMC in its membership embraces some of the best climbers and climbing educationalists in the world.

We urge you to TAKE ACTION NOW by sending this letter, duly signed, to your local MP.
