As part of a nation-wide countryside clean-up campaign, plastic bags have been deposited at Tan-y-Wyddfa for the use of anyone who is going on the hills - the idea being that a small amount of rubbish collected by many people will greatly reduce the litter problem in the area.

Also at the hut, it is proposed to provide a certain amount of 'maintenance equipment' for individuals to use when conditions on the hills are not up to scratch. To this end it is hoped that any surplus paint brushes, tools etc will be donated to the hut.

Due to the suspected presence of our furry little rodent friends at Heathy Lea, Peter O'Neil has asked that no loose food be left at the hut during the week. Steps are being taken to eliminate the problem altogether.

SUBSCRIPTIONS
