However the inconvenience is not very relevant as the pub next door never seems to shut. The alternatives are to stay in the Inn itself (in which case make your own arrangements, tel. 04983-271) or to camp on the Village Green just behind the pub.

There are various ways of getting to Weardale:

- (1) M1/A1 to Scotch Corner, A66 to Barnard Castle, B6278 to Stanhope, B689 to Nenthead about 6 miles before Alston.
- (2) M1/A1 to Scotch Corner, B6275 in direction of Bishop Auckland, turning left onto A68, then B689 behind Fir Tree.
- (3) Longer, but possibly more straightforward: M6 to Penrith junction (No. 40). Follow A66 toward Brough but shortly turn left along A686 to Alston, then A689 eastward to Nenthead.

The relevant O.S. map in old 1" series is Sheet 84, but it appears that in the 1:50,000 series you will need Sheets 87 and 91. Please let me know as soon as possible if you are interested in coming on this meet.
