Just before Ambleside take the A593 road towards Coniston - after approx. 4 miles turn right, then left for Little Langdale. In Little Langdale village, turn left after passing the Three Shires Inn. The Hut is the central house of a terrace of three, on the left, at the point where the road becomes unmetalled. Map reference 316030. I will be in the Three Shires from 9.00 pm.

Stair - Leave the M6 at the Penrith turnoff and take the A66 towards Keswick. After by-passing Keswick, turn left after 1 mile, through Portinscale, past the Swinside Inn to Stair. At Stair, take a left turn signposted "Little Town". The Hut is 100 yards further on the left - Map reference 237211. I will be in the Swinside Inn from 9.00 pm.
