Alps 1985

Ian Brindle - Chris Jonson

At the recent Alpine Discussion evening, two venues were proposed for this summer's Alpine Meet, hence two write-ups have been received -

Alps 1985 - Zinal (1675m.)

<u>Ian Brindle</u>

The Val d'Anniviers, one of the Swiss valleys, gives access to four 4000 metre peaks with routes PD+ or AD, Ober Gabelhorn and Zinalrothorn, up to TD+, North-East face of the Dent Blanche. There are numerous lower peaks with excellent routes, for example the Grand Cornier has three ridges (PD+) and a North-East face (D+). The climbing in the area is rock, mixed or snow and ice - something for every taste.

The campsite at Zinal has 60 places, and no less than 4 hut walks start there. Zinal offers shops, a bank, restaurants, an indoor swimming pool and a cable car to half-way up the peaks on the west side of the valley.

Alps 1985 - continued/

Prices at the St.Jean campsite (150 places), about five kilometres down the valley from Zinal, are; Adult 2.80 S.F. + 0.30 tax, Children 1.50 S.F. + 0.30 tax, Car 1.50 S.F. and Tent 1.00 S.F. (Currently 3 S.F. = £1.00p).

The Dauphine - A Possible Venue for the Alpine Meet 1985 Chris Jonson

For those not familiar with the Dauphine, it lies in an area south-east of Grenoble. Lying wholly within France, it is the most southerly of the high alpine areas of Western Europe. The highest peak in the area is the Barre Des Ecrins at 4102 metres but the most famous is probably La Meije, the traverse of which ranks as one of the great alpine classics.

The region should be considered as one of general mountaineering rather than as having a bias towards either rock or ice. It is certainly a very attractive area with some splendid walking (which everyone samples since the hut plods are not noted for their brevity). The weather is generally better than that encountered in the other alpine regions and, if the season is disastrous, one can escape to the Verdon which is only two or three hours awav.

Choice of campsite is difficult since there are quite a lot of options. It's probably better to consider somewhere over to the east rather than the more popular La Berade.
