#### THE ALPS 1986

A meeting at the Rowing Club on March 11th decided that this year's Alpine Meet would be held at Visp in Switzerland.

Visp is in the Rhone Valley and the area has the best (driest and sunniest) weather conditions in Switzerland. It is conveniently situated for climbing in the Pennine Alps in the Saas Fee, Zermatt and Zinal areas and in the southern part of the Bernese Oberland. This allows an enormous choice of climbing in every grade.

Camping will be at the municipal site in Visp which is situated in pleasant meadow and orchard country within easy walking distance of the shops in Visp where there are several supermarkets, many other shops of all types, as well as plenty of bars and restaurants. The municipal swimming pool is only two minutes walk from the campsite and one payment per day gives unlimited access.

Last year campsite charges were about  $\pounds 2$  for two adults, car and tent. Charges for this year will be given in a later newsletter. # Fell Race Report and Results 1986

Results of the 1986 Fell Race held this year at the Cliff Inn, Crich, were as shown below. In case you weren't there, or just can't remember, there was one course and penalties were dished out-for disobedience at check points -

3.	not completing the tyrolean traverse	15 mins.
4.	not eating 2 dry cream crackers	4 mins.
	not whistling 'God Save the Queen'	6 mins.

Total running time plus penalties was factored by a reasonably scientific Kimberley factor to ensure that the fast men were handicapped. Two prizes were awarded, the traditional trophy for Oread Members - and for non-members and Cliff Inn locals, a bottle of champagne!

Apropos the minor confusion at check point 1 where certain vital information was not initially available, an official enquiry was held and Fred found guilty. He will not be organising the race in 1987. The calculators decision is final (course times are given below to the nearest minute).
