Wilersley. Car Parking.

Parking has again been causing a problem at Wilersley. Please do not park at the A6 entrance either by the gate or on the verge. This causes antagonism and is unnecessary. Perfectly adequate parking exists at the south end in the Cromford Wharfe car park (not on the Cromford meadows).

Access at Rainster Hill Brassington.

Following an incident at Rainster Hill in early May when four tents, two minibuses, and various litter and excreta was discovered by the owner Mrs Bond, a notice has been put up. It reads, "Private Land. No shooting, no climbing, no camping and ramblers please keep to the footpath".

Chuck Hooley, on behalf of the BMC, is currently negotiating

but it may be a long time before any decision is arrived at regarding access. Two recent incidents in which climbers were asked to leave and which ended in such willful acts as taking the gate off its hinges have not assisted.

If you are confronted please be diplomatic, respect the owners wishes and leave by the footpath if asked to do so. The footpath runs from the Barn on Lots Lane (the unmetalled track) to Rainster Hill, MOT from the gate at the bend in the road.
