A very successful weekend. Building materials were ordered on Thursday and were delivered promptly at eight-thirty Saturday morning. This brought us smartly to our feet and with bacon butties still clinging to our teeth we unloaded the vehicle. The object of the exercise was to refurbish one bedroom, 'HEBOG', with pinewood cladding.

The work proceeded apace; by Saturday evening the Hut resembled a demolition site, but by Sunday afternoon the whole thing had taken shape. The plaster and lath walls that had been ripped out had been replaced with rockwool insulation and plasterboard, damp-proof membrane and wooden framework was fitted where required. By Sunday evening the room was ready to receive the pine cladding, which will be fitted on a mini working party in a few weeks time.

Other jobs which were completed were painting out the lounge with emulsion "Mushroom colour"; there was enough left to paint the downstairs toilets, also a coat of Lakeland green emulsion was applied to the drying room area.

On behalf of the Club I would like to thank everyone who attended; I think we all agreed that Margaret Hooley 'single handed' did a splendid job in keeping us all supplied with hot soup and drinks when required. I have been asked to make a special mention of the energetic approach to demolition of walls as demonstrated by our prospective member Steve Bashforth, who also as my amanuensis has produced a supplmentary report in the Hut log book. My personal thanks to John Shreeve for stage managing the whole event, to Frank Starkey for his technical expertise, and last but not least to the rest of the team for their hard work through the hours of dust and grime.
