I have managed to obtain the services of Phil Nixon ARPS as judge for the event. Phil gave us a slideshow in March about his trip to Greenland. 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Action Aesthetic People Prints Club interest

Each exhibitor may enter up to four slides in each category. The prints section requires four prints arranged on a backing card to be judged as an ensemble. The four prints need not be based on a theme, it being up to the competitor to decide what will most impress the judge. Each competitor may enter up to two backing cards for the prints section.

The winner of each category will receive a cash prize of £5. There will also be the usual points system for deciding an overall winner: 4 points for a first. 3 for a second and so on. The overall points winner will receive the Norman Cochrane silver cup. Second overall also gets a cup and for the first time I have decided to award a £5 prize to the competitor with the highest points score who has never won a section or come first overall in this or any previous Oread competition.

All entries must have been taken within the past two years. Entries which gained points in last year's competition will not be allowed. All entries must reach me by Saturday 3 October. Either hand them direct to me at The Brunswick or leave them at DMC. marked "c/o John 0/Reilly" and the shop staff must also be told that the slides are to be passed on to John.

Whatever you do. don't forget to mark each slide with your name, the category for which it is entered and with a spot in the bottom ieft corner on the side from which the side is to be viewed. The October newsletter will come too late to remind you of the closing date, so please start sorting your photos now.
