Wednesday 31 March Harborough Rocks



The main event will be at Harborough Rocks. I intend. as last year, to climb instead at Rainster Rocks. Park near the church in Brassington and walk via the public footpaths to the top or the East hill, where the owner Mr Breakwell is rejuctant to allow climbing. It is possible that other climbs may be taken en route.

Sunday 4 April Spring Stride Harry Fretty Amid public acclamation, the Sunday day walks are back.
