Cader is the ideal compromise between the grassier walking only terrain of the more southerly parts of Wales and the familiarity and crowded conditions of the rock climber's Mecca in Snowdonia. With an excellent campsite, views over the estuary and a tradition of Oread climbing on the main cliff of Cader by such stalwarts as Ray Handley and Doug Cook in earlier times, what more could one want. Stuart has agreed to look after the meet on my behalf as it may not be possible for me to attend. Camping will be at 698150 just off the minor road about 1/2 mile south west of Gwernan Lake Hotel. (Turn left by the telephone box when travelling from Dolgelley) Please give me a ring on the Wed, or Thurs before the meet for any further info, if planning to go. I will liaise with Stuart C.R.

## August Bank Holiday Pembroke Keith Gregson. Aug 16-19+

Camping will be at Rhosson Ganol Farm, St. Justinian's. Ref. 727252 (note Ed. this is not a telephone number, neither is it the missing start time for Pete Janes' meet!) (30-15 Keith, your apostrophe was incorrectly positioned -Ed.)

To find us, follow signs for St. Justinian's lifeboat station from St. Davids: from the cross, down the hill past the Farmer's Arms, then again down past the cathedral and keep on towards the lifeboat station. Rhosson farm is overlooked by a prominent hill with a small radio mast on top. The campsite is under the seaward side of this hill: turn left just past the farm house, which is on the right. We usually camp in the first field on the left.

The Oread has long traditions in Pembroke. Alas gone are the days of "rugby Club all nighters" but they have been replaced by Old Eltonians with the Carnells, barbecues with the Fosters (depending on the fishing), and Feeling Foul ale at the various hostelries! There is of course lots of climbing to be done, most of which is in the middle grades and still retains the feeling of remoteness and pioneering. There is a new guidebook which reveals many of the "secret crags", but even better, I'm assured that Whymper's old Guide "Big Foo" will be with us to direct exploration.

I always look upon this meet as the best holiday on the Oread calendar. There is lots to do, climbing, walking, swimming or simply lying on the beach etc. And the company is excellent, so come and join us.
