Obituary -Walter Richardson 1934-2002

Walter joined the Oread in the early fifties and, keenly enthusiastic, he rapidly became a first class mountaineer completing many notable climbs. A few of the most memorable times were the two Skye ridges with Jack Ashcroft, Brian Cooke and Jim Kershaw and weekends at the "Road Menders" in Llanberis with Ernie Marshall and others.

We had several Alpine holidays together and I well remember the time when we travelled to St. Nicholas on his Triumph Tiger twin. We stayed at the home of an old, bedridden guide in Taesch to whom we had to relate our exploits on our return from each trip which included the traverses Taeschhorn-Dom (Domgrat), the Weisshorn, the Zinal Rothorn via the Rothorngrat and the North ridge where, on lescent to the valley, Wally was attacked by a herd of goats. Typically of him, he saw a funny side to this experience.

We had many trips into Derbyshire, which included desperate journeys in his Austin 7 open sports tourer; far more dangerous than any rock route.

Wally also climbed extensively with Brian Richards, before Brian took up residence in Switzerland, and later, he teamed up with Gill Male, when Gill lived in Burton.

Our last visit to the hills together was shortly after his heart by-pass operation when he and

Glenda spent a few days with Janet and me. We had a fine, sunny day walking on the Howgills and he thoroughly enjoyed being out on the hills again.

Wally was a proud family man, a lover of classical music and, in his later years, a keen gardener who kept hens and two allotments. His great enthusiasm was infectious and he will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

Walter died peacefully, seated in his armchair, and leaving us with many happy memories. Our thoughts are with Glenda and his family in their hereavement.

- " 1. All roadside parking areas and lay bys in Snowdonia to be closed.
- 2. Strict no parking bylaws to be enforced by traffic wardens.
- 3. The few carparks that will be allowed to

remain will be subject to 2 hours maximum stay at peak times.

- 4. I you wish to spend the day in Snowdonia you will be forced to park your car in one of the "gateway" carparks.
- eg. Llanrwst, Llanberis, Bethesda, Portmadoc.
- 5. Pay a large fee for parking your car and then pay for a bus which will eventually take you to your destination within Snowdonia.
