Camping will, as usual, be at Rhosson Ganol Farm, St Justinian's (GR 727252).

To find us, follow signs for St Justinian's lifeboat station from St David's. From the Cross, down the hill past the Farmer's Arms, then sharp right down past the Cathedral (one way system) and keep on towards the lifeboat station until you

see the sea, with Rhosson Farm on your at. The farm is overlooked by a prominent hill on the left of the road and the campsite is under the seaward side of this hill with views over Ramsey Island and the sound. Turn left up a track just past the farmhouse, take the right fork and then keep to the left. We usually camp in the first field on the left.

The Oread has long traditions in Pembroke.
