The committee are calling for this S.G.M. as at the last A.G.M. insufficient members were present to form a quorum to discuss and vote on a change to rule 7.2.

The committee feel that this alteration is of prime importance in protecting the Trustees of our property f any financial liability.

committee also feel that in the future, decisions that may need to be taken with some urgency at an A.G.M. may be delayed due to the lack of the necessary quorum, so the decision was reached that in addition to the proposal to amend rule 7.2 a proposal to add a second paragraph to rule 17 be put to the membership. This proposal if successful would allow an A.G.M. [that has insufficient members present to form a quorum] to instruct the Hon. General Secretary to conduct a postal ballot of all the membership.

Proposal 1:-

To alter the last sentence of rule 7.2 to read:-

The Trustees are entitled to an indemnity from the Club members against all claims for damages, interests and costs as a result of the holding of their office.

At present rule 7.2 states:-

Any freehold and leasehold property of the club and any investments authorised by the committee [other than cash which shall be under the control of the Treasurer] shall be vested in Trustees for the Club and all property vested in them shall be dealt with by them as the Committee shall from time to time direct by resolution of which an entry in the minute book shall be conclusive evidence. The number of Trustees shall not be more than FOUR or less than TWO. The Trustees shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of Club property.

Proposal 2:-

To add a second paragraph to rule 17.

If an A.G.M. or S.O.M. is inquorate, then the meeting can request that the Hon. General Secretary conduct a ballot of the full membership on the resolution. The resolution shall be decided by a simple money of the votes cast.

sent rule 17 states:-

No alteration to these rules shall be made except at an Annual General Meeting or a Special General Meeting and only if supported by not less than two-thirds of those present and eligible to vote. One quarter of the Full Membership of the Club forms a quorum. Proposed alterations shall be submitted in writing to the Hon. General Secretary not less than 28 days before the Annual General Meeting, and the Hon. General Secretary must notify all members of the proposed alterations at least 14 days before the Annual General Meeting.
